

# **David's Incredible Journey**

Three years ago, Anglicare Victoria financial counsellor Elaine\* received an emotional phone call from a young father whose partner had suddenly passed away from an asthma attack. "He said to me that he was lying on her grave in the middle of the night and was not coping with her death," said Elaine.

David\* unexpectedly found himself a single father with three young children and was struggling financially as well as emotionally. He had to give up his full-time job to care for his kids and did not have enough money to pay for his partner's funeral.

After Elaine spoke to David, she arranged a loan for him to help pay for part of the funeral costs. She then referred him to Anglicare Victoria's Emergency Relief centre and assisted the family with vouchers, food and essentials. "The quarterly utility bills were causing distress, but I contacted the retailers and got David on payment plans to help him budget," Elaine said.

Anglicare Victoria also supported David's kids through the Children with Hope program, which helps disadvantaged children enjoy every day experiences. David's eldest son Thomas was really struggling after losing his mother. Thomas would often jump out of his bedroom window in the middle of the night or punch holes in the walls when it all became too much for him to handle. Thanks to the *Children with Hope* funding, Thomas was able to start martial arts training after school and channel his energy in a more positive way.

Elaine now visits David and his family occasionally, and is happy to see them healthy and well. "When I visit them to drop off hampers that have been donated, they are always so grateful. I know there is a lot of focus on single mum families, but I want people to know that there are many single dads out there that need our help too," said Elaine.

# Parentzone: Preventing Harm

Sita\* came to Anglicare Victoria because she wanted to "stop showing her anger with the kids" and she confided that she had been shouting and smacking her children when they would not follow instructions. Through the Parentzone group program, Sita learnt new skills and strategies to deal with her own feelings, which led to a more calm and consistent approach when dealing with her children

She began using family meetings, rules, consequences and praise as positive parenting tactics, while also making time to care for herself and her own needs. Sita's evaluation of the program left her "really impressed" and she stopped resorting to the "shouting, anger and smacking," which in turn made her relationship with her children closer.

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# **Behind The Scenes: Staff Profile**



Introducing Leigh Rankcom

Leigh Rankcom has been working for Anglicare Victoria for 15 years and is the Team Leader for Integrated Family Services.

## Can you tell us a little about your role at Anglicare Victoria?

My staff and I work with families in their homes to help them make positive changes that improve the well-being of the parents and their children. We work with parents and help them explore how these changes can occur, what the barriers to change are, and we discuss how to overcome them.

#### Did you have a moment when you suddenly realised how much of a difference Anglicare Victoria was making?

I had been with Anglicare Victoria for about a year, and was working with a client who was completely overwhelmed by the stress in her life and past trauma. She found it hard to see a positive future for her family, and her struggles were preventing her from having a good relationship with her children.

I worked with her on some skills and strategies to help her relationship with her kids and she was very dubious at the start, but she gave it a go for a few weeks. One day at a session, she cried and told me she finally has hope for the future, and she was connecting with her children like she always wanted to. Things were far from resolved but hope was restored, a family became a family again. I knew I was really making a difference then.

# What do you wish other people knew about your work with families?

The families that we work with come to us at a time of despair,

in need of understanding and a sense of hope. For whatever reason, they are struggling to access the strength in them, but want to improve their family and to have a home where everyone is better. All they need is someone with patience, knowledge and compassion to help them.

# What would you tell someone about why they should support Anglicare Victoria?

The people that work here are all driven by one goal: to see transformational changes in the lives of our clients. You know that regardless of what capacity you are employed in, you are in part helping people make changes and giving them hope for the future.

Without the help of our amazing donors and supporters, we would not be able to achieve this.

## What do you do when you aren't working?

I have a busy home life with three children, as a family we love being involved in our church activities. I also really enjoy four-wheel driving and camping outdoors, it is always good to get away from technology!



# **Gina's Story**

Christmas is a wonderful time of the year for most of us. However, for thousands of women and children affected by family violence, Christmas can be terrifying.



Anglicare Victoria work in many instances where family violence has affected the lives of the women and children that we help. Women like Gina\*, who can still recall the moment when she realised what her options were:

"I knew I could either stay and end up being killed by him, or leave with my son and try and keep us safe," Gina says.

When Gina first got involved with Anglicare Victoria's *Choices* Program, her caseworker Wendy\* was not sure if Gina would fully participate in the program.

"I initially believed that Gina would not engage with the program. However, ten months on from first meeting Gina, she is one of the most engaged clients that I have worked with," Wendy says.

Gina is now a young mother with two children, a sevenyear-old boy and an 18-month-old baby daughter. She resides in stable, private rental accommodation that she sourced herself.

Gina finally feels safe:

"Anglicare Victoria really helped us get back on track. I know that I can call my worker whenever I need to and she will be there for me. Anglicare has helped me and my family feel secure again."
