Welcome to the Parentzone Northern Newsletter for Term 4 2019

Once again Pz has been extremely busy in term 3, running some regular groups and trialling some new ones as well! PBS for carers was delivered in Mildura, together with Pz Southern, for Carer Kafé. The evaluation was so positive that Centacare now want to engage Pz to run PBS for professionals there next year. PBS was again delivered in Arabic. Pz also trialled PBS in English, but with Arabic and Turkish speaking co-facilitators, for translation of key concepts. Feedback was very positive and allowed for greater participation for some participants. We will be reporting back to Pz in the other regions on how to adopt this CALD friendly approach for their parent groups. Bilingual co facilitation opportunities and translated materials will continue to be a key focus for service development in the Northern region. Our family violence group also went extremely well this term, with a record number of participants and strong support networks and relationships emerging. Pz continues to build on co-facilitation opportunities to work with dads and male caregivers as well. A Dads building solutions group this term with 20 attendees provided some very positive feedback in Moreland. We also ran a dad's taster in City of Whittlesea with 12 attending and looking forward to a full group of Dads building solutions in term 4. PBS for professionals ran at capacity this term, successfully recruiting a number of bilingual participants. We also implemented the new assessment matrix. Jo and Jess both received an A, the highest grade, for level 4 PBS trainer accreditation, thus enabling Pz Northern to conduct our own assessments of PBS facilitators in future. Congratulations are in order to both Jo and Jess for this superlative result! Jo T was invited to present two sessions on Resilience to over 200 participants at the Hume City Council's Families, Youth and Children conference 2019, pic below. This afforded the opportunity to showcase the range of groups and services offered by Pz, with promotional and networking opportunities flowing on from this great event. Pz will be hosting a Week Without Violence event in term 4, to honour the strengths and resilience of the fantastic women we work with each year. Pz would also welcome the opportunity to co-facilitate more PBS groups next year, and build on our delivery in community languages and for dads and male carers. Northern Parent Educator Network

Term 3's NPEN meeting invited Carol Clark from FaPMI to discuss "Keeping Mental Health on the Parenting Agenda". Carol identified the work she does and then expanded on the effects on individuals as well as parents. We discussed how mental illness can impact the whole family and the parenting role. The meeting finised by identifying how we can support families in our own role and reflecting on the information discussed during the session. A number of resources were also shared which was extremely useful for the participants attending.

The next NPEN meeting will take place in Lalor on Wednesday 11th December from 10am. We are delighted to have Jo Rodriguez and Vicky Limbrick from Catholic Care, Bendigo to present on their new programme "My Kids and Me" which is a parenting programme for families who do not have their children in their care. Parentzone and Family Services news

Family Services and Parentzone continue to work in partnership throughout 2019 and we were delighted to have Elmas from the Short Term Family Services Team co-facilitate a Parents Building Solutions programme with Hanan. This was not facilitated in another language however there were parents of Arabic and Turkish backgrounds who were supported in the group. We also had Bec from Family Service Team Members co-facilitate in Doreen, this was the first time a group was located in this area and attendance and participation was very strong with a 73% retention of the group.

We ran PBS for Professionals from the Broadmeadows Women's House and had one staff member from Lalor FS attend and we look forward to being able to cofacilitate with her in 2020.
