FAMILY VIOLENCE ORANGE DOOR

The Orange Door is a new way for women, children and young people who are experiencing family violence or families who need assistance with the care and wellbeing of children to access the services they need to be safe and supported.

It is free to access help and support through The Orange Door and you do not need a referral. The Orange Door will be rolled out across Victoria by 2021, with operations beginning in some of the first locations from May 2018.

The Orange Door is open in Barwon, Bayside Peninsula (this includes the whole Peninsula, across the City of Casey, which has other services), The Mallee and North Eastern Melbourne

Our Place, together with the Queen Elizabeth Centre, is running **'Baby College'** at Doveton College in 2019.

What is Baby College?

Baby College aims to improve educational outcomes for disadvantaged infants by engaging and supporting vulnerable families from the prenatal period. Baby College was successfully trialled at Doveton College in 2017-18 and was found to:

- ü provide extra support to the most vulnerable mothers who may miss out on first-time parent groups and MCH key ages and stages visits and playgroups
- ü support mothers during the antenatal period when stress can occur and negatively affect unborn babies
- ü be delivered in a non-threatening and non-judgemental environment that was easy and welcoming for parents to access
- ü provide opportunities for building relationships, making social connections and decreasing social isolation
- ü use skilled facilitators to model positive parenting practices and play
- ü deliberately start slow to draw out mother's needs and develop rapport
- ü provide a single entry into the service system prior to childbirth, onsite at school and linked to other existing Services, to overcome barriers to service access for vulnerable families.

Aims of Baby College




- Ø Sustained engagement with families of children at risk of poor learning and academic outcomes from the prenatal period
- Ø Improve the learning, safety, health and development of children
- Ø Build strong parent-child relationships
- Ø Create more stimulating home learning environments
- Ø Enhance parental wellbeing, competence and confidence
- Ø Increase community connectedness
- Ø Ensure more timely identification of family needs and actively support engagement with secondary prevention services
- Ø Connect and transition parents into programs and supports.

Content

Evidence-based content is delivered by two highly skilled facilitators weekly to provide newborns with the best and supportive start in life. The latest advice on safe and recommended sleep and feeding guidelines are covered, underpinned by attachment theory, the circle of security and an understanding of brain development. Evidence-based resources and expert presenters are drawn on to deliver a number of sessions. Core topics covered include:
