TRANSFORMING EDUCATIONAL ACHIEVEMENT OF CHILDREN AT RISK

Anglicare Victoria's TEACHaR Program has made a huge difference to the education of vulnerable children and young people for almost a decade. While first developed for young people in out-of-home care, it has grown to support students, carers and professionals all across Victoria.

TEACHaR meets the educational needs of all vulnerable children and young people (4-18 yrs old).

Education Specialists (teachers) work collaboratively with children and young people, their carers/parents, school staff and other professionals to transform their feelings and attitudes towards learning. By creating a positive environment towards learning, this personalised program helps to:



Increase school
engagement and
attendance



Improve literacy,
numeracy and
academic skills



Access higher education
opportunities at the same
rate as peers

Services offered include:

- One-to-one learning between student and highly experienced teachers
- Flexible learning environments, including home, school or online
- Variable program length to suit the needs of the student – between 4-40 weeks
- Support and advocacy at critical times such as the transition from Year 6 to Year 7
- Educational strategies to manage complex classroom behaviours
- Specialised support and collaboration with school staff
- Trauma informed, strengths-based learning techniques
- Evidence-based educational assessment tools; progress tracked and outcomes measured
- Assistance with funding for vital education resources and activities
