Welcome to the ParentZone Northern Newsletter for Term 4 2020

Our aim is to provide a responsive, innovative and accessible Regional Parenting Resource Service. We use a strengths based, culturally-sensitive and gender-appropriate approach for families, carers and professionals with children aged 0 - 18 years of age within the LGA's of Whittlesea, Hume, Moreland, Nillumbik, Banyule, Darebin and Yarra.

Welcome to the Team Leader update for term 4! The team at PZ have become accustomed to the online group delivery platform and have received some wonderful feedback from participants this term, many of whom have said that this platform can make it easier to attend. There has been a noticeable uptake in out of region enrolments, which we welcome if the groups are not available in other PZ areas or with other regional parenting services. We have also observed increased enquiries from professionals and community members all looking for additional services in the current climate, while many services, at least initially, were providing phone / email support only. The term 3 online groups booked out in about two days! As well as a range of parenting groups, we were excited to run Circle of Security online for the first time in 3rd term, for which the feedback was outstanding. In term 4 we are delighted to be offering PBS for rainbow families for the first time and we will also be facilitating PBS for Professionals training online in addition to our suite of parenting groups. Please contact us for further information. Parenting after Violence is also being delivered, however, please note that it is already completely booked out. Another new initiative in term 4, in partnership with local councils, is a PBS style parenting support group for new mums, who may be isolated from regular supports and services in the current climate, please refer timetable attached.
