With as much as three times the usual demand for services in some areas, the need to create pandemicsafe practices in our service delivery to families rapidly ushered us into a new era of online operations. Thanks to the dedicated work of our teams to evolve into a digital environment, programs like ParentZone were able to successfully migrate online within a short period of time.

The single most significant reform to child welfare in a generation



The Home Stretch campaign has applauded the Andrews Government for its nationleading pledge to offer extended care arrangements to every young person in the state on an ongoing basis.

From 1 January 2021, the Home Stretch program will provide an accommodation allowance to every young Victorian in out-of-home care until the age of 21. This means a young person can remain living with their kinship or foster carer if they wish, or transition to supported independent living arrangements.

"This announcement will transform the lives of vulnerable young people for the better, giving them options they would not have if their support had been terminated at 18 - as it is for the majority of young people across the country," Paul McDonald, Chair of the Home Stretch campaign said.



Nurturing with nature

During Victoria's lockdowns and in celebration of Kinship Carers Week, our Kinship program came up with a creative and fun approach to strengthen the bond between children and carers, while also fostering a connection to the natural world during the lockdown.

The Kinship 'Grow it, Eat it' project delivered over 40 Grow Kits with pots, soil and vegetable seedlings to Kinship families.

Later, an instructional online group session was held via video conference.

The children planted all kinds of vegetables, including strawberries, carrots, tomatoes, chillies, and sunflowers, and had a lot of fun. One carer wrote, "My grandchildren are very happy and enjoyed themselves this afternoon. They are asking when the next one is."

The team behind the project plan to deliver more online workshops. One of the upsides of lockdown has been the learning of new online skills by staff and carers, allowing greater access to families with less demand on their time.

In the spirit of generosity

Norm Geschke: An Australian hero who believed in giving a fair go.

In 2018, at age 96, Charles "Norm' Geschke passed away. Having lived a life of contribution towards his country and community, his final act of kindness was leaving a gift to those whom he felt a great sense of empathy for: the vulnerable and disadvantaged children of Victoria.

Recently we met with his son, Phillip, who described his father as a strong-willed man of many talents and interests with a deep drive to serve and support those around him.

As a teenager living through the Great Depression and the Second World War, he was instilled with a deep sense of service, justice and compassion for vulnerable people.


He signed up for the RAAF on his 19th birthday, and by the end of his service he had flown 17 different types of aircraft including Australian-built Mustangs and Lincoln bombers

Norm went on to become the Director of Consumer Affairs. "He believed in fairness, he'd see injustice and chase it," remembers his son, Phillip.

Norm devoted time to many areas of interest but never lost his care for young people.

When he saw the local Youth Club was struggling, he applied his strong organisational skills to reinvigorate its essential role in young people's lives.





Throughout their life, Norm and his wife Audrey made significant donations to over 35 different charities. Norm's final wish to provide support to young people living in Out-of-Home-Care encapsulates a life of service and is typical of Norm and Audrey's generous spirit.

Norm's lasting legacy

Sandy* had been living in residential care with AV for many years following a challenging upbringing. When Sandy was about to turn 18, his mind was preoccupied with the difficult reality of leaving state care.

Norm's gift allowed AV staff to set Sandy up with much-needed tools and work clothes for his new employment as a part-time concreter. Sandy was overwhelmed with appreciation.

AV's Out-of-Home-Care Manager, Trevor Day, said, "These extra funds have been a godsend. We are in the business of creating memories for our young people, and Sandy will cherish his 18th birthday for years to come."

A safe space at Atrium Place

For more than 120 years, the location upon which Atrium Place sits has delivered care to vulnerable Victorians. Today, the premises continues its history of care by offering accommodation that provides the perfect space for people and families to find refuge and rebuild their strength.

During the pandemic, Atrium Place was a haven for helping vulnerable families facing the challenges of lockdown. In September, along with others, AV provided a family of seven a safe space to recover from COVID-19. Working with AV's TEACHAR program, we also delivered the children education packs, specifically designed to maintain their connection to school during isolation.



Our team provided outstanding care to manage the complexities of the situation and support alternate housing as the family left our care.

Community leaders said the response provided to the family had given their wider community confidence in asking for support.
